15. Quinta da Comporta - Wellness Boutique Resort — Carvalhal, Portugal →

The vision of Portuguese owner-architect Miguel Câncio Martins, Quinta da Comporta is very much in line with the low-key vibe of its eponymous village. There's no flashy entrance: check-in happens in a wood-and-thatch gatehouse reminiscent of a traditional fisherman's hut. Sandy pathways wind past the vegetable garden to a central terracotta courtyard dotted with sofas under shady pergolas. And two barn-like reclaimed-wood buildings stand on the site of old grain stores; one is home to the spa, the other an open-plan bar and restaurant (you'll be asking for the recipe for the seafood bisque). Rooms are refreshingly simple: white walls, sisal rugs on smooth concrete floors, wicker armchairs. Borrow the hotel's bicycles and pedal along to Carvalhal beach, a 15-minute ride away, or spend afternoons by the long, glass-sided pool.
